LCCA Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Lake Carmi Campers Association was deemed a big success by the 87 members and guests who attended. The meeting was held at the

Franklin Town Hall with a delicious pot luck supper before the annual meeting.

Immediately following the wonderful pot luck supper, Eric Hansen of the Vermont Loon recovery Project (VLRP) was introduced for a great program on loons, their life styles and much more. Hansen is a biologist, he has been working for the project since 1998. His program, titled "**Loon Conservation in Vermont....People Make the Difference**" was a big hit with the largest group to attend the annual meeting in anyone's memory.

Although we do not have a nesting pair of loons at Lake Carmi, Hansen noted that Lake Carmi has great potential for the future. This summer there have been at least four loons in residence. Two of those four are a possible pair as they are usually seen together. One is much larger than the other indicating that they might be a male and female. A large single loon has been a regular visitor around the camps all summer. It is believed to be a male.

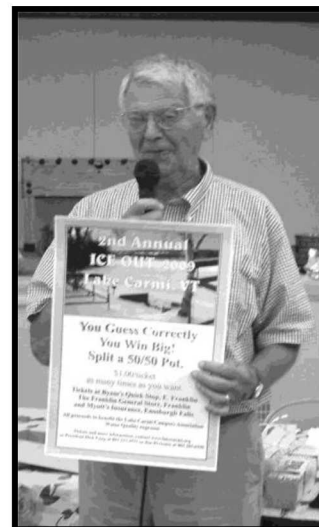
The LCCA business meeting took place after the program. Treasurer Wendell Fortier presented the 2007 annual statement. (See page 3)

Elections were held for the Board of Directors and Officers for 2008-09. Directors Albert Perry, Ruth Ann Krayesky, and Roger Vachon were all re-elected to

three year terms.

Enclose a stamped self addressed envelope to get your ticket stubs back in the mail.

The ice out date for 2008 was Sunday, April 13 at 1:32 p.m. The winner received a check for \$500.00. We anticipate a much bigger pot for 2009.

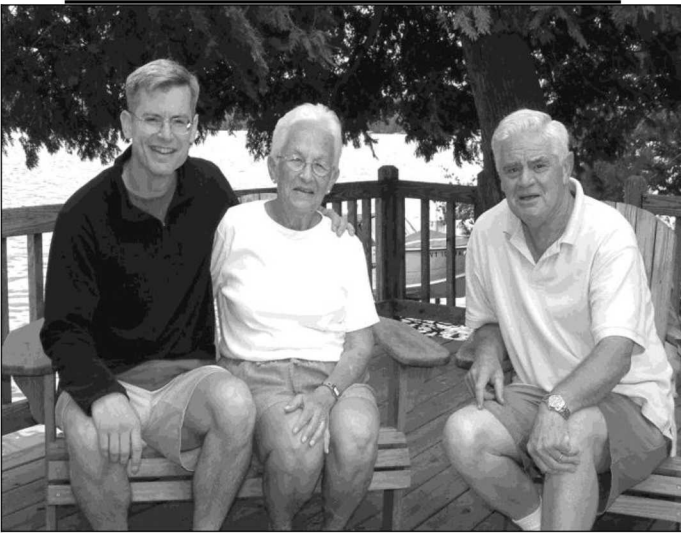

Lt. Col. Michael Colburn Honored



Mike Colburn (LEFT), 43, grew up at Lake Carmi. His parents Vern and Betty Colburn of St. Albans bought their Shore Road cottage in 1971 (when he was 6 years old). So Mike, his sisters and parents were fortunate enough to spend their summers on the lake.

In a recent conversation, on the deck overlooking the lake, he relived some memories of his summers, riding bikes, swimming, and getting into mischief he wouldn't divulge.

His memories include the many summer days with Clark and Betty Hubbard's children, of the same age. They were always playing at the lake or at the Hubbard's Franklin farm. One particular memory was the swim lessons at the lake with Erwin Weiss. Mr. Weiss taught generations of Lake Carmi families and friends to swim at the, then North Beach. He remembers a lot of music practice too, and the annual

talent show at the Franklin Town Hall.

Mike Colburn was the subject of a full page article in the *Burlington Free Press* on July 20. He is the director of "The President's Own Band." Col. Colburn was recently presented the Legion of Merit, for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding services and achievements. This award is the 6th highest award that can be bestowed by the military.

The band is responsible for presenting the music for all White House functions and dignitary presentations. He noted that the biggest honor is to work with such professionals as make up the U.S. Marine Corps Band.

He is a 1982 graduate of BFA St. Albans. He joined the band in 1984 and became conductor in 2004. Colburn is now sharing the joy of Lake Carmi with his children, Jack, 14 and daughter Claire, 12. His wife, Nancy, is also a St. Albans native who has been coming to Lake Carmi since she was 17.

Why the Name, Lake Carmi?

A question often asked, and few know the answer. Silver Lake was the original name, Franklin Pond followed. Many still call our lake Franklin Pond. But, we should inform them that it has been Lake Carmi since 1910 and it's time for them to catch up with the times.

In Thompson's book, *History of Vermont*, published in Burlington in 1842, it is written, "The township is injured very much by a large pond which lies near the center." Of course, at the time, the town was nearly all woodland and wilderness, life was very different from today. It is understood the main users of the lake were the local Indians.

So, how did we get the name Lake Carmi? The Marsh Family owned a farm at the south end of the lake. That farm is now the Lake Carmi State Park. Their son Carmi L. Marsh was born in 1842. He joined the 18th Vermont Volunteer Infantry of the Union Army to help fight the Civil War. Below is a photo of his grave marker at the Missisquoi Cemetery in Enosburgh Falls where his family is buried.



So why Lake Carmi? After the Civil War, Carmi Marsh's mother traveled to Virginia where she found a very sick and wounded son. She hired a local woman to nurse him back to health good enough to get him returned to his beloved home in Franklin, on the southern shore of the pond. [This of course meant travel by horseback, wagon or stage coach, a pretty rough ride.]

After recovery he farmed successfully for many

years and then went into business with the Kendall Spavin Cure Company in Enosburgh Falls, making and distributing horse medicine across the nation. He was a most successful businessman. He built a big house in Enosburgh, just south of the current Bob Young home on Main Street.

The Franklin history, published in 1989, tells us Carmi Marsh did not forget his beloved farm or Franklin and the soldiers who served in the Civil War with him. To show his appreciation to the men he served with, from the Town of Franklin, he presented the town with the large Soldier's Memorial Monument standing in Memorial Park in Franklin (formerly called Marsh Park).

In 1910, the year of his death, the Town of Franklin petitioned the Vermont Legislature to change the name of Franklin Pond to Lake Carmi in honor of the memory of Carmi L. Marsh. That name change was immediate upon the passage of the resolution that year.

The information provided in this article is mostly from *A History of Franklin*, by Martha Towle, 1989. Copies are available from the Town Clerk's Office or the Franklin Historical Society.

[Editors note: Why the name Carmi and not Marsh? Marsh would indicate a marshy or swampy area, certainly not the beautiful Lake that we are so privileged to be a part of today.]

The presentation takes her from her Victorian childhood, through the years of her "little books," to her final thirty years of farming in England.
