Whether it was the franklin Fire and Rescue 1000 person event or the little family events around the lake, everyone was happy and cheering in the holiday weekend. The Biggest Event, Pontoon Boat Relay

New to Lake Carmi, perhaps even new to the world, the Pontoon Boat Relay was a huge success under the leadership of event chair Bob Lumnah. The idea was presented to the board of directors last year as a way to build up interest and spirit at Lake Carmi. It was more successful than any planners could hope for. With five teams of five boats, the action was unprecedented. The twenty five competing boats gathered at the north beach area about 6:30 p.m. preparing for the announcements and the starters signal.

As the starting competitors lined up, the other relay boats headed for their next "ball" transfer on the lake. As the signal was sounded,



the boats took off -some of them. A little reshuffling of crew placement was necessary to

get some boats moving out of the sand (mud). They were off and speeding around the lake. In this photo, the Yellow Team Captain Joe Craig's Wildcats (above) of the Westcott/Mullen Shores make their first transfer out by the island. The green team boat (Dueling Dolphins of Dewing Road/Camp Road) awaits their partner boat to arrive. The next time this writer would catch up to

Hammond Shore) made a very quick transfer, from Captain Bob Larose's boat to Randy Farrar's boat, challenging the Red Team for the lead. By the time Farrar came around the corner at Shore Road, he was in the lead preparing to take the winners' trophy from the bigger horse-powered Red Team (Pirates of the Pontoons from Patton Shore/Blackwoods).



Memories from Ed Hubbard

Ed Hubbard, son of Guy Hubbard, and formerly of Enosburg remembers some great times at Lake Carmi from 1945 to 1954, "right after the great war." He writes: "Upon return from the service my parents purchased a camp at the north end of the lake. Each summer from Memorial Day to Labor Day we spent at Lake Carmi. The main activity location during this period was the bowling alley.



"Felix LaFlam owned the business where you could roller skate all day for a quarter and bowl for a quarter per string. On weekends cars were parked on both sides of the road from West Patton Shore to Vic's Crossing. Soft drinks, popcorn, and hotdogs were the menu. Swimming was popular at the beach. A diving raft was located in the deeper water. Bath houses were available for changing.

"The business prospered for quite a few years: Old Felix smiled when he went to the bank. He sold the business around 1950 because business declined; probably due to television coming into favor.

"Lake activities were mainly fishing, boating and swimming. For us, fishing was the prime activity on the lake. Perch and bass fishing were popular. There was an over an over-abundance of perch and they were caught anywhere in the lake. In fact the perch population was out of balance with only small ones being caught. As a result, the Vermont Fish and game Department, stocked Northern Pike around 1950 to control the perch population and achieve the balance.

"Jon Anderson, a fish biologist (for the State of Vermont), told me they shock tested the lake and turned up 40 - 50 lb. northern pike. I was assured the photographs were on file.

"Boating was primarily for fishing. Most outboards were in the 3 to 10 HP range. There were no camps in the southern parts of the lake, just a few in the area of the island. Boating was mostly in the north end.

"As you would expect, life was simple, enjoyable and great to reflect on as one grows older." [Editor's note: this trip down memory lane was not copied in its' entirety. Thank you Ed Hubbard]

LCCA Inc. Ad hoc Weed Committee

Since last summer this committee has been studying the weed problems in Lake Carmi. Much of the information gathering has been thru meeting and talking with the experts and folks from other lakes with similar issues. On July 14 the committee traveled to Lake Morey to meet with the Lake Morey weed expert and chair of their committee, Don Weaver. Before the 2.5 hour meeting, the committee toured the lake, seeing a crystal clear water with no milfoil or algae. Ten years ago Lake Morey was nearly unusable due to these problems, which included high levels of phosphorus. They tackled the phosphorus problem first, with application of alum, sealing the lake bottom. Treatment of the lake for weed control began in 2008, beginning their five year plan. directors also have them.


