Raft Safety?

Several questions have been raised about rafts at the lake. We have fewer than ever before, perhaps related to our feathered friends who like to use them to roost, or perhaps a safety issue.

Keeping the seagulls away is not easy, but can be done. Fake owls are quite effective. They can be purchased at McCuin's in Highgate Center. Another item is a *"Spider,"* several are used on boat canopies, they'll work on rafts too. They are available at Boat Headquarters in Swanton.

As for safety, make sure your raft is not placed out in the lake too far. The recommendations are to place them inside the 200 foot range for swimming, making sure they are marked well. Reflectors on every corner, both sides, are needed too. If you are in what could be a boat lane, the raft should have a warning light after dark, just to be safe. There is one properly marked on Hammond Shore. Put the raft close to shore for the weaker swimmers and please keep track of who is using the raft.

Having your raft visible at night is just as important as having your boat easily visible!



The Franklin Watershed Committee is excited to kick off this August with help from Ameri-Corps Volunteers. They will be out and about working on Shoreline restoration and Water Conservation Projects, as well as projects in other parts of Franklin.

The FWC is launching a new program to save local residents money by saving the longevity of their septic systems, reducing water use, and improving water quality through the reduction of water entering the lake. In support of this goal, we will provide and install *free* water efficient aerators and showerheads to lakeshore property owners. 
